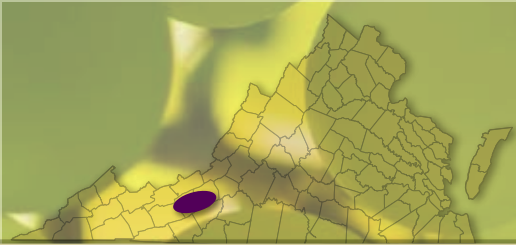


Blacksburg Vacinity Virginia

CHÂTEAU MORRISETTE

Château Morrisette is one of the oldest and largest wineries in Virginia. Located in a spectacular natural setting in rural southwestern Virginia, this winery production building and visitor center is considered the largest salvaged timber-frame building in the United States. From light-bodied Rieslings and buttery Chardonnays, to the bright fruit of Chambourcin and rich, full-bodied Cabernets, the Chateau Morrisette wine making team makes over 18 different award-winning wines.

From Blue Ridge Parkway at milepost 171.5; turn west on Rt. 726 (Black Ridge Rd.). Make an immediate left on Winery Rd. Tasting room is .25 mile on the right.

Davis Valley
WINERY

Davis Valley Winery and Vineyard is Smyth County's first farm winery. This winery is located in the perfect spot for a detour along America's favorite scenic road, the Blue Ridge Parkway, and right on the path to Virginia's Crooked Road. 45 acres of grapes are nestled on a beautiful 363 acre estate in the mountains of Southwestern Virginia, just minutes off Interstate 81 at Exit 54. Sample wines from a 100-year old oak antique bar and enjoy the spectacular panoramic vistas from this scenic hilltop setting. One mile off of Interstate 81 between Wytheville and Marion. Take exit 54 at Groseclose; proceed west on Rt. 683 and continue to the right on Davis Valley Rd.

Rural Retreat Winery & Vineyards is Russell County's oldest winery, located in the Heart of Appalachia. Here you may taste locally grown Steubens and DeChaunacs as well as Chardonnay, Cavernet Sauvignon, Golden Muscat and Seyval, Blush and Rose's, Vidal Blancs, Taminettes and Barter Theatre wines bottled by Dye's.

From I-81 take exit 60 and turn toward Rural Retreat (HWY 90). At the stop light (HWY 11) continue straight on HWY 90. When you come to the Rail Road tracks make a right onto Railroad Ave. (Do not cross the tracks). Make an immediate right onto North Church Street. You will see us on the left.

Villa Appalaccia is located on the Blue Ridge Parkway with stunning views and a relaxing environment. The winery produces only Italian-inspired wine grown

only on the estate vineyard. Italian grape varieties are used to make award-winning Sangiovese, Primitivo, Pinot Grigio, Malvasia, Aglianico and Corvina/Rondinella blends as well as extraordinary Cabernet Franc. The vineyard is one of the few not planted on clay with the result that our wine is true to its Italian heritage.

Located on the Blue Ridge Parkway between mileposts 170 and 171. Five miles south of Rt. 8 on parkway to Rt. 720 (on left - go 300 yards) or 6.2 miles north of Rt. 58 on parkway to Rt. 720 on right - go 1/2 mile.

WEST WIND FARM

Vineyard ~ Winery



West Wind Farm is a fourth-generation homestead high in the heart of Appalachia. The vineyards here are

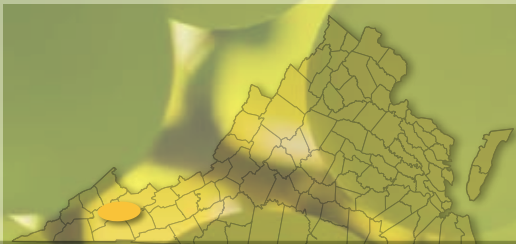
situated on high enough, dry enough, wet enough terroir to be comparable to the prime wine growing regions in Central Europe and the Yakima Valley in Washington State. This is perfect for Cabernet Sauvignon, Gewurztraminer, Pinot Gris, Cabernet Franc, Riesling, Pinot Noir, and Chambourcin. Elevation, cool nights, well-draining rocky soil and other factors go far in making west Wine Farm vineyards unique and in generating a distinct, high-quality crop of grapes.

From I-81 take exit 80 and proceed 4 miles south on Hwy 52 (Fort Chiswell Road).

Heart of Appalachia in Southwest VA





Abingdon Vineyards is located on 53 gorgeous acres in Washington County, along the South Holston River, near Holston lake. This destination in the Appalachian mountains, is known for its outdoor activities, Blue Grass music, story telling, mountain crafts and the famous Virginia Creeper trail, 1/2 mile from the winery. Abingdon boasts an impressive list of 22 wines, handcrafted from Norton, Cabernet Franc, Cabernet Sauvignon, Chambourcin, Chardonel, Riesling, Traminette, Vidal Blanc, Viognier and Chardonnay.

From I-81 exit 19; take US-58 east toward Damascus to Rt. 722. Take a right onto Rt. 722; follow paved road for 2.4 miles (road changes to Rt. 710-Alvarado). Turn right into winery entrance.

MountainRose Winery and Vineyard is located in the heart of the coal mining region of the Appalachian Mountains. This vineyard, planted in 2003, began as a farm only, growing 6 varieties of grapes and selling some them to nearby wineries. Today MountainRose features 9 wines under their own label and a Tasting Room that overlooks a gorgeous pond high in the Appalachians.

From Wise: Take SR 646 (Darden Drive later Coeburn Mountain Rd.) toward UVA College at Wise. Continue on SR 646 for 5 miles and turn left onto SR 644 (Pole Bridge Rd). After 2 miles, turn left on SR 682 (North Reservoir Rd). Go .4 mile and turn right at the pond. Follow the drive to the yellow and green building that is MountainRose Vineyards.
